Research Network Q “Asian Capitalisms”

The Call for Papers for Research Network Q “Asian Capitalisms”, included in the SASE 2020 Annual Conference to be held in Amsterdam 18-20 July 2020, The Netherlands, has opened.

SASE is an international, interdisciplinary organization with members in over 50 countries on five continents. The academic disciplines represented in SASE include economics, sociology, political science, organization studies, management, accounting, psychology, law, history, and philosophy (<https://sase.org/>).

Network Q promotes theory and research on the diversity of socio-economic systems and capitalist development in Asia. We welcome a wide range of theoretical perspectives (e.g. comparative and international political economy, economic sociology, management studies, industrial relations, innovation studies, neo-institutionalism, and comparative institutional analysis). New approaches to the study of Asia are needed to better understand how different systems and their socio-economic institutions such as labor markets, capital markets or product markets and outcomes (e.g. comparative advantages, innovation, cooperation, and specialization) are related. The network promotes studies that examine these relationships as well as how processes of institutional change affect them. The network contributes to an interdisciplinary perspective on trajectories of development within Asia and consequences for socio-economic development beyond Asia.

For the 2020 conference, the call for papers of Research Network Q is organized into five sub-themes:

1. Varieties of capitalism in Asia: State, business, and society
2. Platform capitalism in Asia: digitalization, networks, and value chains
3. The globalization of Asian economies
4. Made in Asia: innovation, entrepreneurship, and emerging sectors
5. Financial, labor, and social institutions in Asia

Our research network is looking for proposals for single paper submissions, and panels and network conferences (sequences of 2 or 3 panels). Submissions should be done through the SASE website and indicate the sub-theme number. Submissions that do not address the sub-themes will, however, also be considered.

The deadline for submissions is **10 January 2020**. Once logged into www.sase.org, simply click on the green "Membership and Registration" button in the top right-hand corner of the SASE website to begin the submission process. Note that SASE seeks to promote gender equality. We thus strongly encourage you to take gender balance into account in panel proposals.

A call for travel grants and the award for best paper, both funded by Fondation France-Japon de l'EHESS (<http://ffj.ehess.fr/>), will be available on the SASE website.
